Welcome to THE BIG READ and the 12th year of citywide reading in Santa Monica! THE BIG READ is a community reading initiative of the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) in partnership with Arts Midwest, designed to celebrate literature by encouraging people to read and discuss the same book at the same time throughout their community.

This year's book is *Into the Beautiful North* by Luis Alberto Urrea. A contemporary novel set in the U.S. and Mexico, *Into the Beautiful North* features strong characters and universal themes that are sure to promote quality group discussion and enjoyable events. New this year is the opportunity to explore the book's themes in artistic workshops offered in partnership with the Santa Monica Museum of Art.

Into the Beautiful North is available from Santa Monica Public Library or your local bookstore. Spanish-language copies are available at the Library. We encourage you to attend one of the many free, public events being held around the city from March 29 through May 4.

About the Book

Nineteen-year-old Nayeli lives in Tres Camarones, a Mexican town nearly empty of men, including Nayeli's father, after most have gone to the U.S. to seek work. Inspired by the classic film, *The Magnificent Seven*, Nayeli and her three closest friends are commissioned by the new village president, Nayeli's Aunt Irma, to travel north into the U.S. to bring back men to protect their town from encroaching drug dealers. In this classic quest tale, Urrea uses humor and compassion to address issues of cultural differences and depict the many borders in life that both divide and connect.

About the Author

Luis Alberto Urrea is the author of fourteen books including poetry, short stories, novels, non-fiction and memoirs. He is the recipient of a 1999 American Book Award (*Nobody's Son*), a finalist for the 2005 Pulitzer Prize (*The Devil's Highway*) and a member of the Latino Literature Hall of Fame. Raised in both Tijuana and San Diego by his Mexican father and American mother, Luis is a graduate of the University of California, San Diego, and the University of Colorado Boulder. He is currently a professor of creative writing at the University of Illinois at Chicago and resides in Naperville, Illinois.
