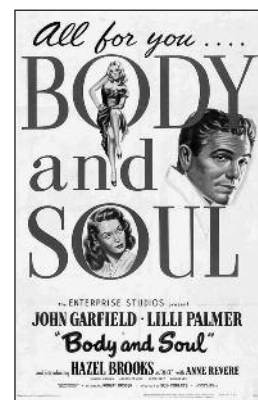
MY BROTHER JACK (1999)

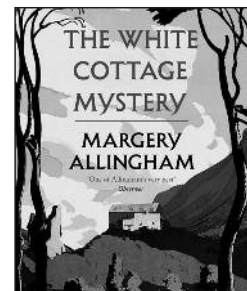

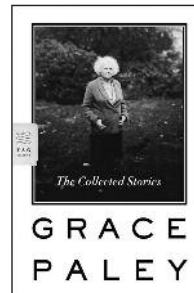

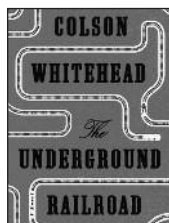
