The Collection

Santa Monica Public Library is a Funding Information Network Partner of the Foundation Center, a national organization that provides education and training about grant seeking, philanthropy, and foundations in the United States. The Santa Monica Public Library collection consists of a core group of directories and manuals published by the Foundation Center plus additional titles on corporate funding, government funding, special interest funding, starting and managing nonprofits, and grant proposal writing.

The Foundation & Grants Collection is located in the Main Library of the Santa Monica Public Library. Most of the collection is in the Reference Department. However, copies of how-to manuals and prior editions of many of the foundation directories can be borrowed from the regular nonfiction collection.

Professional Librarians are available to assist clients in the use of resources during all hours the Library is open to the public. Staff are unable to perform extended research for clients or to assist with grant writing.

Foundation Directory Online: Helping Nonprofit Organizations

Foundation Directory Online Professional is the Foundation Center's database which contains information on over 140,000 grantmakers and 3.8 million recently awarded grants. The information is compiled from a variety of sources including grantmaker questionnaires, press releases, telephone contacts, annual reports, electronic grants data, newsletters, and the 990-PF forms foundations file with the IRS.

Foundation Grants to Individuals Online

This Foundation Center database includes profiles for nearly 10,000 foundation and public charity programs that provide support for students, artists, researchers, and other individual grantseekers.

How to Access the Foundation Center Databases:

The above databases are available only from computers located on the second floor in the Main Library. The eSource Station computers are near the Reference Desk where Reference Librarians can assist you. The Internet computers, located in front of the Periodicals Department and in the Internet Commons, are available for use for up to 2 hours per day.
